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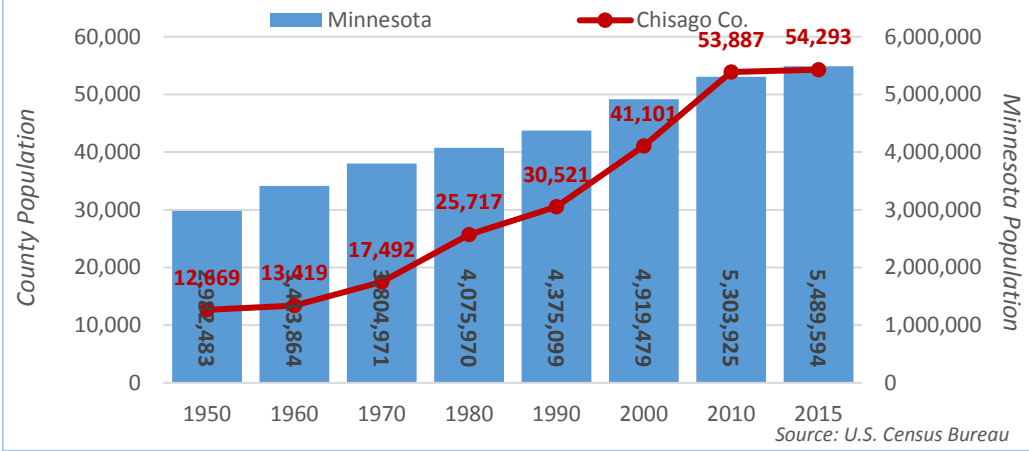

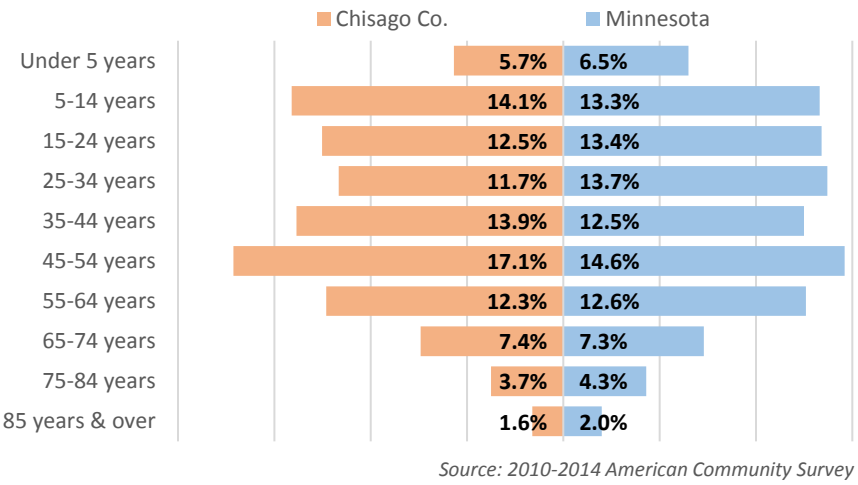
Figure 1. Population Change, 1950-2015

Figure 3. Population Pyramid, 2000-2014

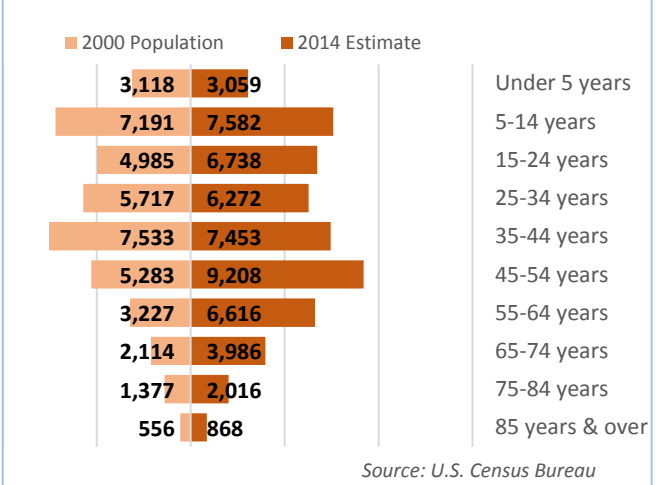


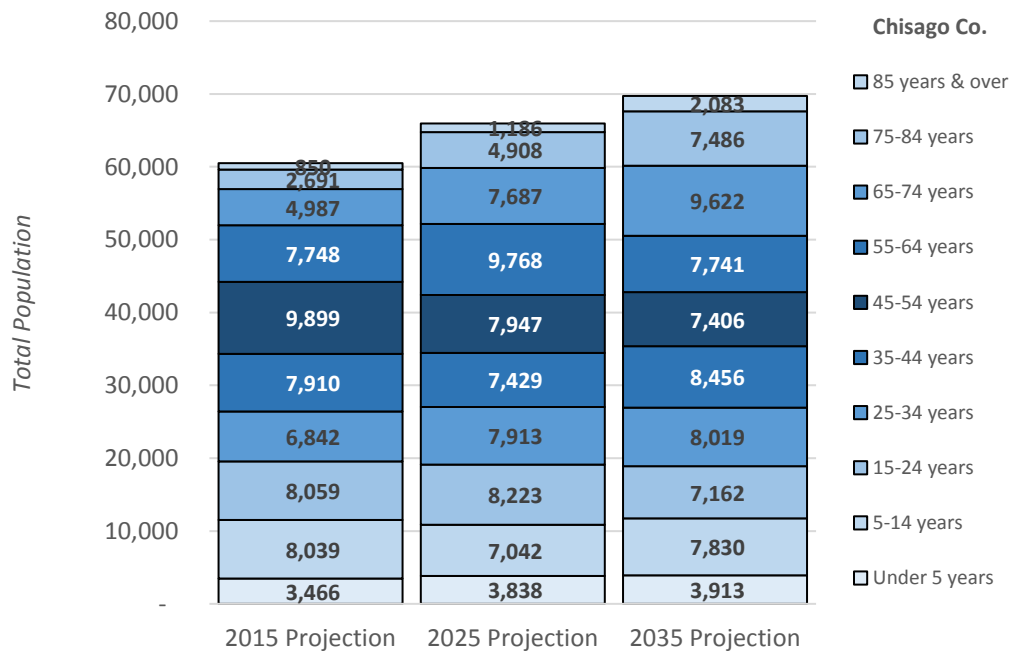

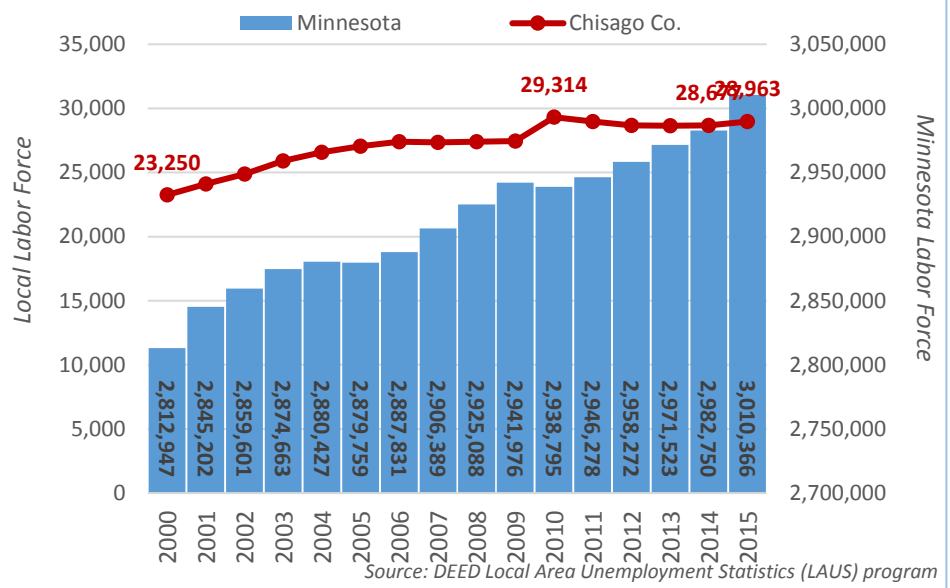

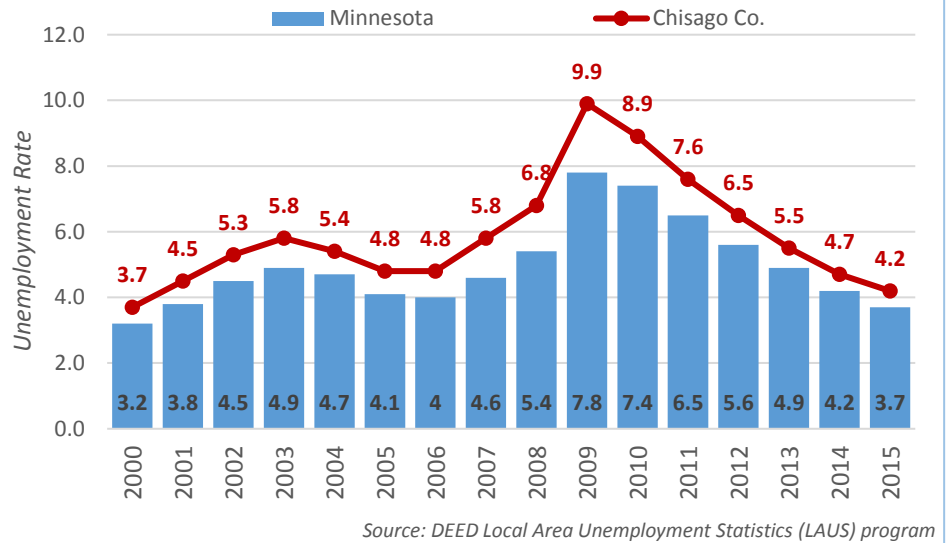

Figure 5. Annual Labor Force Estimates



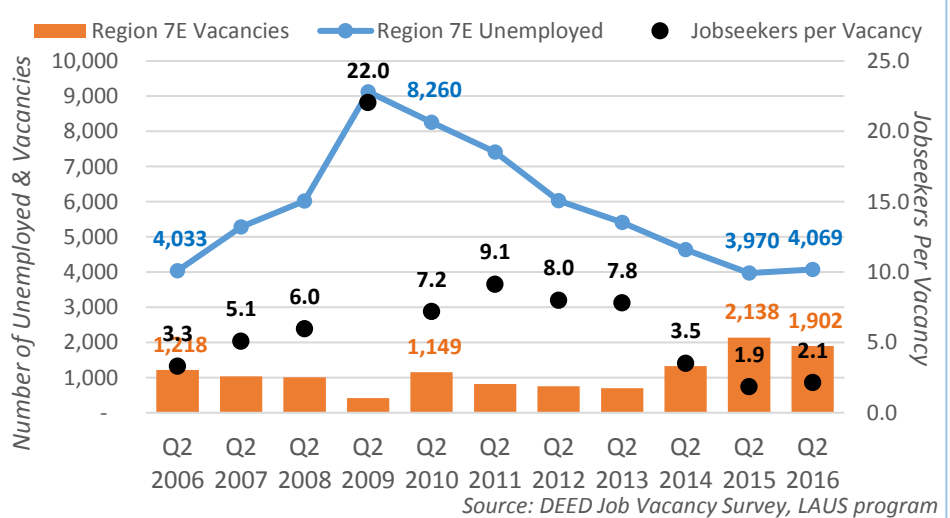

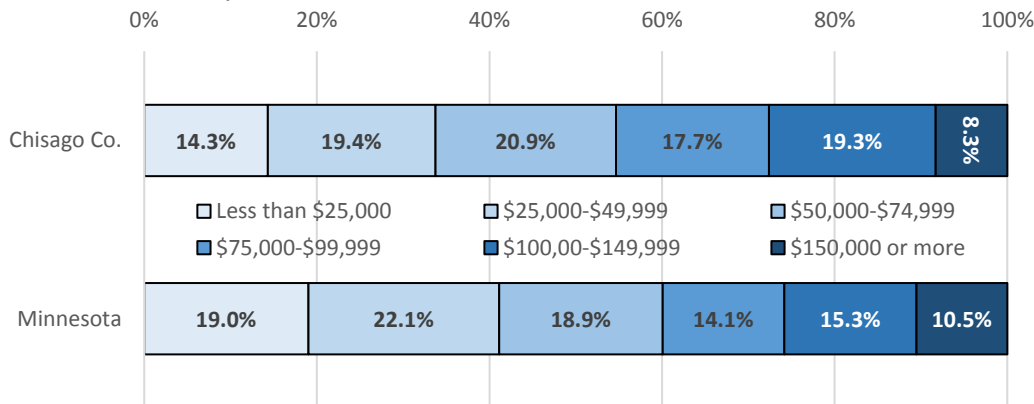

Figure 8. Household Incomes, 2014



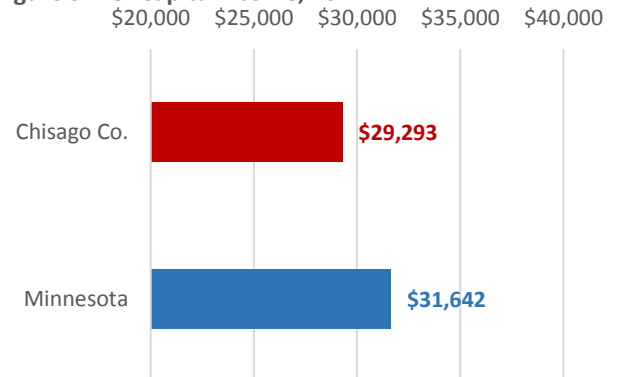

Figure 10. Job Vacancies by Industry, Qtr. 2 2016

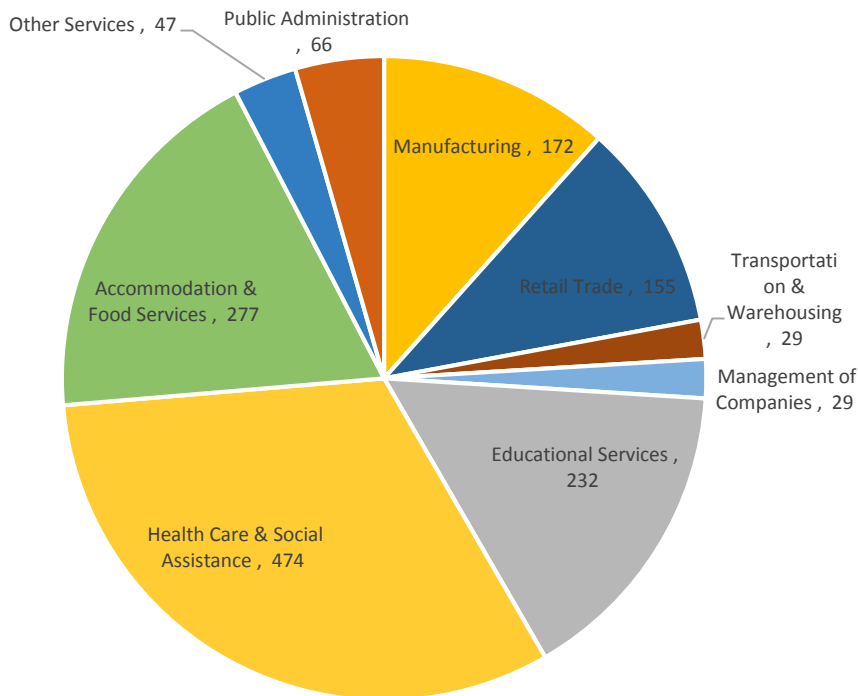
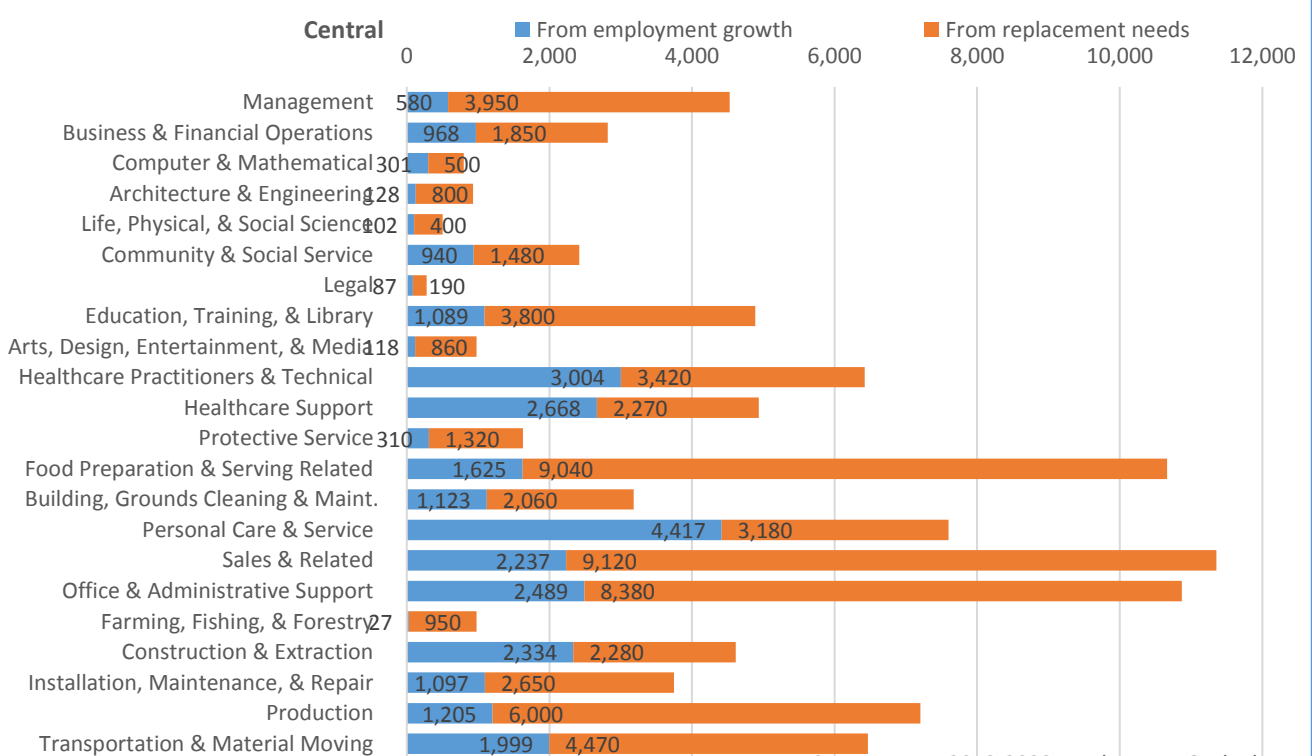

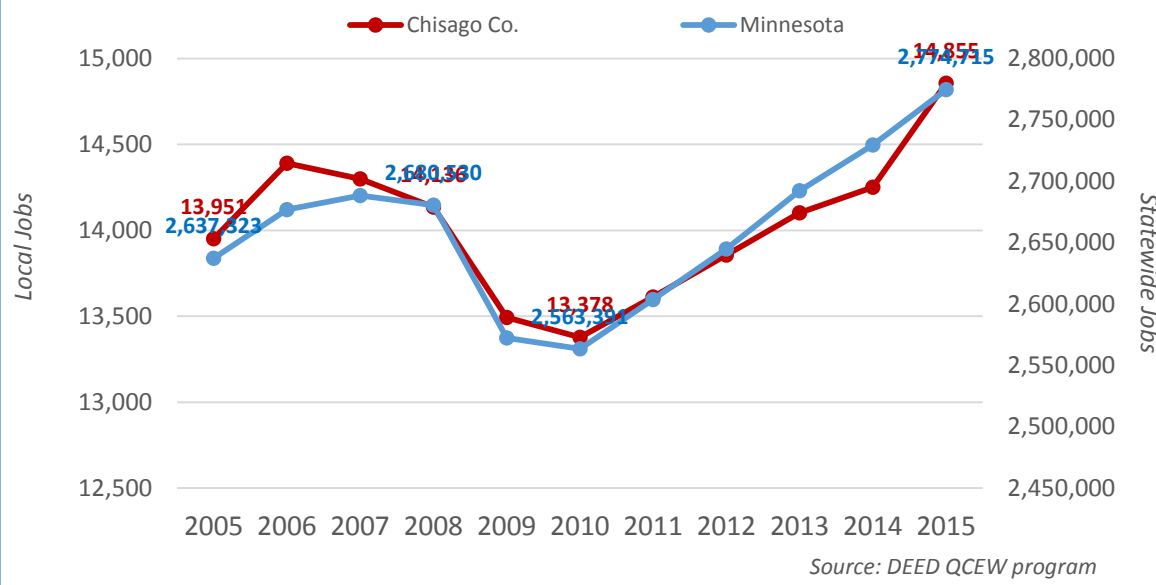
